OFFICIAL NOTICE

These By-Law changes will be voted on at the September 19, 2023 Lodge meeting.

ARTICLE V: ELECTIVE OFFICERS AND DUTIES

Section 1. The elective Officers of this Lodge shall be an Exalted Ruler, an Esteemed Leading Knight, an Esteemed Loyal Knight, an Esteemed Lecturing Knight, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and five Trustees; and no member can simultaneously hold more than one office in the Lodge, elective or appointive.

All Officers shall be elected annually for a one-year term, except that Trustees will hold five-year terms with one Trustee to be elected annually. All Officers and Trustees shall serve until duly removed or otherwise until their successor is elected and installed.

Change to read:

Section 1. The elective Officers of this Lodge shall be an Exalted Ruler, an Esteemed Leading Knight, an Esteemed Loyal Knight, an Esteemed Lecturing Knight, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and Three Trustees; and no member can simultaneously hold more than one office in the Lodge, elective or appointive.

All Officers shall be elected annually for a one-year term, except that Trustees will hold Three-year terms with one Trustee to be elected annually. All Officers and Trustees shall serve until duly removed or otherwise until their successor is elected and installed.

Reason for change: This change from a 5 year to 3 years for trustee, no one will be removed from office we just not vote for trustee for 2 years.

OF THE SECRETARY

Section 4. He shall notify the members of all committees of their appointment, together with the subject given into their charge; copy reports in the minute book, when directed so to do; require Members to pay their dues in advance of each upcoming dues period; send a written notice to all Members in arrears for dues; attend to all duties required by the Laws of the Order, and all such other duties as may be legally imposed upon him by the Lodge and are inherent in and pertain to the duties of his office. He shall have charge of the seal, books, papers and records of the Lodge, under the direction of the Exalted Ruler. He shall, on or before the first day of May of each year, electronically file the Annual Membership and Charity Reports furnished by the Grand Secretary to that Officer via the Chicago Lodge Membership System, properly filled out, mailing check or draft to pay in full all indebtedness of the Lodge to the Grand Lodge, including all Grand Lodge dues collected or due from

Members of this Lodge, and said report shall bear the name of the Exalted Ruler and Secretary. He shall certify to the Grand Secretary the vote of the Lodge upon all constitutional amendments. On the 1st day of November he shall furnish to the Office of the Grand Secretary such membership statistics as may be required, via the Chicago Lodge Membership System as directed by the Grand Secretary. He shall attend all officially called District Deputy Clinics for his Lodge unless excused for good cause shown to the District Deputy with jurisdiction. For the faithful performance of his duties he shall receive as compensation \$5,700.00 per annum, payable monthly.

Change to read:

He shall notify the members of all committees of their appointment, together with the subject given into their charge; copy reports in the minute book, when directed so to do; require Members to pay their dues in advance of each upcoming dues period; send a written notice to all Members in arrears for dues; attend to all duties required by the Laws of the Order, and all such other duties as may be legally imposed upon him by the Lodge and are inherent in and pertain to the duties of his office. He shall have charge of the seal, books, papers and records of the Lodge, under the direction of the Exalted Ruler. He shall, on or before the first day of May of each year, electronically file the Annual Membership and Charity Reports furnished by the Grand Secretary to that Officer via the Chicago Lodge Membership System, properly filled out, mailing check or draft to pay in full all indebtedness of the Lodge to the Grand Lodge, including all Grand Lodge dues collected or due from Members of this Lodge, and said report shall bear the name of the Exalted Ruler and Secretary. He shall certify to the Grand Secretary the vote of the Lodge upon all constitutional amendments. On the 1st day of November he shall furnish to the Office of the Grand Secretary such membership statistics as may be required, via the Chicago Lodge Membership System as directed by the Grand Secretary. He shall attend all officially called District Deputy Clinics for his Lodge unless excused for good cause shown to the District Deputy with jurisdiction. For the faithful performance of his duties he shall receive as compensation \$9,000.00 per annum, payable monthly.

Reason for change: Over the past 6 years, the increased time to perform the duties with additional reports required by Grand Lodge justifies the increase and we have not increased compensation in over 10 years.

OF THE TREASURER

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all the Lodge moneys from the Secretary, giving him a receipt therefor; and, except as otherwise provided by By-Laws, he shall be the Treasurer of all Committees of the Lodge, and shall handle all funds of all Committees and of every activity of the Lodge; pay all bills against the Lodge as ordered thereby on vouchers signed by the Exalted Ruler and Secretary, except as provided in Section 12.060(f); keeping a correct account, under their proper dates, of the amounts and sources of receipts and the amounts and purposes of disbursements, taking proper vouchers for the various items thereof. He shall, at such times as the Lodge may direct or the Exalted Ruler require, present for examination all books, papers, vouchers, etc., that may be necessary to a proper auditing of his accounts. He shall also perform such other duties as are required by the Lodge, and are compatible with his office. Whenever the amount of unappropriated cash in his possession shall exceed \$10,000.00, he shall notify the Chairman of the Board. He shall present a report at each regular meeting showing the condition of the funds of the Lodge. He shall be required to give bond to the Lodge in the sum of \$5,000.00 for the faithful performance of his duties, and shall receive as compensation for his services the sum of \$5,700.00 per annum, payable monthly.

Change to read:

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all the Lodge moneys from the Secretary, giving him a receipt therefor; and, except as otherwise provided by By-Laws, he shall be the Treasurer of all Committees of the Lodge, and shall handle all funds of all Committees and of every activity of the Lodge; pay all bills against the Lodge as ordered thereby on vouchers signed by the Exalted Ruler and Secretary, except as provided in Section 12.060(f); keeping a correct account, under their proper dates, of the amounts and sources of receipts and the amounts and purposes of disbursements, taking proper vouchers for the various items thereof. He shall, at such times as the Lodge may direct or the Exalted Ruler require, present for examination all books, papers, vouchers, etc., that may be necessary to a proper auditing of his accounts. He shall also perform such other duties as are required by the Lodge, and are compatible with his office. Whenever the amount of unappropriated cash in his possession shall exceed \$10,000.00, he shall notify the Chairman of the Board. He shall present a report at each regular meeting showing the condition of the funds of the Lodge. He shall be required to give bond to the Lodge in the sum of \$5,000.00 for the faithful performance of his duties and shall receive as compensation for his services the sum of \$9,000.00 per annum, payable monthly.

Reason for change: Over the past 6 years, the increased time to perform the duties with additional reports required by Grand Lodge justifies the increase and we have not increased compensation in over 10 years.

ARTICLE X: FEES AND DUES

Section 1. The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant who has passed his twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$50.00, which shall be paid when the candidate presents himself for initiation.

The fee for initiation in this Lodge for an applicant making an application prior to his twenty-sixth birthday shall be \$50.00, which shall be paid when the candidate presents himself for initiation.

Add: The initiation fee in May and June shall be \$20.00

Reason for change : We are allowed to have membership drives.

These House Rules changes will be voted on at the September 19, 2023 Lodge meeting.

3. The Club prohibits illegal possession and use of drugs in any and all parts of the building.

Change to read: The Club prohibits illegal possession and use of drugs in all parts of the property.

Reason for change: Covers all the building and the outside area.

4. No pets are allowed in the Club Rooms or Lodge Quarters unless they are aids to the handicapped.

Change to read: Only service dogs are allowed in the Club Rooms or Lodge Quarters. The owner must be in control of the dog at all times.

Reason for change: member safety and to comply ADA.

6. No solicitation is permitted in the Club Rooms unless it is Elk sponsored or approved by the Board of Governors.

Change to read: No solicitation is permitted in the Club Rooms unless Elk sponsored or approved by the Board of Directors.

Reason for change: Required by Grand Lodge.

8. Only members may participate in the Daily Drawing. A guest of a member may purchase Instant Bingo Tickets.

Change to read: Only members may participate in the Daily Drawing/weekly drawing and the Queen of Hearts. A guest of a member may purchase Instant Bingo Tickets, 50/50 tickets;; the may also participate in e-bingo and Ohio Lottery Machines.

Reason for change: To clear up who can take part in drawings.

10. Foul language and personal conduct not becoming an Elk by any member or their guest will not be tolerated. All incidents will be reported to the Board of Governors. Any violation of this rule or any other rule will result in a warning and possible suspension of Club privileges by the Board of Governors as per Section 16.041 of the Grand Lodge Statutes.

Change to read: Foul language and personal conduct not becoming an Elk by any member or their guest will not be tolerated. All incidents will be reported to the Board of Directors. Any violation of this rule or any other rule will result in a warning and possible suspension of Club privileges by the Board of Directors as per Section 16.041 of the Grand Lodge Statutes.

Reason for change: Required by Grand Lodge

11. All returned checks are subject to a \$30.00 service fee and can result in loss of check cashing or social quarter privileges. Check amount is limited to \$400.00 per day, and you cannot "Buy Back" checks.

Change to read: All returned checks are subject to a \$30.00 service fee and can result in loss of check cashing or social quarter privileges. Check amount is limited to \$400.00 per day,

Reason for change: it could cost money if it's a bad check.

12. The Club Manager and his staff have the right to refuse service. No person in a state of intoxication shall be admitted or allowed to remain in the social quarters. The lodge staff is authorized to refuse service to anyone in a state of Intoxication.

Change to read: It shall be a violation of the House Rules to accept, serve or provide alcoholic beverage by or to any individual when such individual is exhibiting signs of being intoxicated. The Club Manager and staff have the right to refuse service. No person in a state of intoxication shall be admitted or allowed to remain in the social quarters.

Reason for change: Required wording by Grand Lodge.

15. Anyone who has been dropped from any Elks Lodge for non-payment of dues cannot be a guest of a paid member and cannot be an active guest at any Lodge function, per Section 14.190 of the Grand Lodge Statutes.

Change to read: Anyone who has been dropped from any Elks Lodge for non-payment of dues cannot be a guest of a paid member, and cannot be an active guest at any Lodge function, per Section 14.190 of the Grand Lodge Statutes. A dropped spouse may be quest of paid spouse only.

Reason for change: Required by Grand Lodge.

18. If a member is at an Elks function or traveling to or from an Elks function, they will be considered present for lodge drawings.

Added: If an Elk is at a function in the Ballroom or Grillroom, wedding, private party, they must check in the social quarters with bartender and let them know they are in the building at the time of the drawing.

Reason for change: If you are in the building, you are eligible.
